

H2H Network Nagorno-Karabakh Support Package

Assessment support to inform the humanitarian response in Nagorno-Karabakh.

Detailed information on people displaced within Nagorno-Karabakh is currently unavailable, making it hard for humanitarian decision-makers to plan and coordinate. The H2H Network activated its fund to support member agencies that specialize in assessments to collect information on the needs of internally displaced people in the region. Independent, expert analysis will inform and strengthen the wider humanitarian response.

Assessments will be available by early December.

The H2H Network consists of independent, expert service providers for all humanitarian responders in and during an emergency. Here's a matrix showing which services are provided by whom, with their contact information.
